The President's Inaugural Address

Compatriots, PG Jack Manning, President Bill Dobbs, and other dignitaries, it is truly an honor to take the reins of President, Georgia Society SAR during this Centennial Year and when one reads the history of GASSAR, it is also very, very humbling.

Some Past Presidents that I need to thank for their mentoring: Lt. Col. Bob Galer, PG Larry Guzy, Col. George Thurmond, George Wheeless, Charlie Newcomer, Col. Bobby Towns, Terry Manning, PG Mike Tomme, Dr. Ed Rigel,

The President's Farewell (Cont.)

Our Georgia Society acted swiftly with a called BOM to amend our By Laws to allow for electronic meetings, and our Spring, Summer, and Fall Board of Managers meetings were all held on Zoom.

Most of you are aware that we formed an Electronic Communications Committee led by our "Zoom Czar" Rick Reese to not only assist with BOM meetings but to be available to any of our 35 Chapters that requested help. Several of our Chapters have "in-house" IT skilled members who also jumped into duty.

The year quickly turned from a direction of what can we do to generate new members to what can we do to retain the members we started the year with. Gentlemen, you all have shown resilience, creativity, and flexibility this year. Our Chapters, Color Guard, and Militia have done a great job of safe and social distancing and keeping in touch with their fellow members. Chapters have teamed together to bring us video productions such as the "Siege of Augusta" and Fort Morris' "Come and Take It" ceremonies. Some have videoed "Traveling Trunk" presentations for use in schools and Chapter meetings. One Chapter did a Memorial Day YouTube video which was widely viewed. Our membership and new applications actually increased through the year.

At our Summer BOM, we announced that dues collections would be moved up to October 1st, and, with significant assistance from our Information Technology Chairman, Richard Marsh, we rolled out a pilot program which allows for payment of dues online. Seven Chapters participated in the pilot program, and it was a success. We should be offering this to our entire membership in 2021.

The Georgia Society also came together to raise nearly \$15,000 to have our eight "Georgia Revolutionary War Trails" brochures updated and reprinted. We raised \$1,900 to commission an artist to produce a painting of Washington's May 1789 arrival in Savannah. We recently learned The George Washington Endowment Fund agreed to fund the remaining \$1,600 for the painting, which will be completed by the 2022 Congress. The entire Georgia Society is grateful for the assistance from the GWEF Board. VPG Allen Greenly and PG Mike Tomme are Co-Chairing the Congress Committee which is running full-speed ahead.

Our BOM approved the use of \$2,000 from our Endowment Trust Fund to assist the Military Officers Association of America to provide assistance to the Georgia War Veterans home in Milledgeville for operation "Together Again." Gary Hoyt, our Veterans Committee Chairman spearheaded this effort.

The Georgia Society will celebrate our 100th Anniversary on March 15, 2021. We are selling medal sets and lapel pins to honor the centennial. We have increased memberships in Friends of the Library (which can now be made on our website that Richard Marsh set up), and in our Ladies Auxiliary. The Ladies are working diligently preparing for the 2022 Annual Congress. Paul Prescott, our Flag Respect Chairman, pushed through a Chapter Flag Retirement contest. The Georgia Fellows Fund, our version of National's GWEF, has also created the Paul Prescott Award for the Chapter that has the most members joining each year. Lastly, we held a raffle for a Kentucky Flint Lock Rifle as a fundraiser for the 2022 Congress and sold the 200 available tickets in less than 30 days. Our membership has been generous in these troubled times.

Georgia started January 1, 2020 with 1,855 members, and as of December 31, we had 2,102 members. Sadly, we lost 38 members to our Heavenly Father. I previously mentioned the October 1st date for dues. That did not happen. Be it apathy, lack of communication, members used to a December due date, or whatever, we entered December with 450 dues uncollected. However, by the 31st, the Georgia Society was at 92% paid. We will get most of that 8% back in reinstatements. I believe strongly that there should be a penalty imposed for the time and effort required for reinstatement. I do not believe our members realize the additional workload on our State and National Secretaries that are generated by reinstatements. Nor do those who pay late appear to realize that sending their payments to the Society the following year can limit the number of certain medals that can be awarded.

Our Society Editor, Compatriot Emil Decker, told me late in the year that he had gotten rid of all of his pessimism (formerly housed in his now-removed appendix) and that he thought, all things considered with the very trying year that our Society has experienced, we had actually done well. I am going to take Emil's point of view and add that we are a Society of very hardy gentlemen who, whether eager or not, have indeed acquired new sets of skills and different ways of negotiating this pandemic and are poised to hit the ground running when we can once again sit next to each other, see smiles, and actually shake hands!

I am honored that you men supported me as president during 2020. GOD $\,$ Bless You All!

I think every President should have a scripture, and mine is Phil 4:13 that says "I CAN DO ALL THINGS THROUGH CHRIST WHO STRENGHTENS ME." Phil 4:13 – "I Can Do All Things Through Christ Who Strengthens Me" Is also called The 10 Finger Prayer.

A few weeks ago, Brenda and I visited Swainsboro, GA to Install New Officers of the Wiregrass Chapter. While there, we planted U.S. Flags at 2 Monuments. That is what we do, went we travel. Thinking about this year and its many questions, I just do not know what is going to happen? Perhaps in a few months' things will get back to normal (whatever that is) once more people get their China Virus shots. Maybe it will take 6 months or longer!

Why not plant U.S. Flags in each and every county in Georgia? That is 159 Counties, second only to Texas in the number of counties. Brenda and I can not do it alone, but our Society, with over 2,000 members can!

Each GASSAR Chapter has an area of responsibility (or operations) and their compatriots can plant one flag at a grave, a monument, historic marker, etc. in each county within their A.O. Paul Prescott will love this goal. I am going to push to have each Georgia Society Chapter present at least one Flag Certificate this year. Regional VP's can present a Flag Certificate, if they cannot get a given chapter motivated enough to do it. That is 100%. Yes, it is alright for a chapter to present more than one Flag Certificate. Some have already been given.

Another goal is to get the Georgia Society SAR ready for our Nation's 250TH Anniversary. I do not know what this will entail; however, Georgia will be prepared.

What is my management style? I do not micromanage! GASSAR has a Source Book and NSSAR has an SAR Handbook. Read and study them and implement them. Likewise, I don't like surprises. If you have questions, call or email me. I'll resolve the issue or take it to EXCOM!

My major goal is Communication! Some chapters are meeting in person and that is fine, but do not forget those who will not, or can not, attend. Communicate with absent members by email, phone, visit or Newsletter.

Some chapters are meeting by zoom and that is also fine, but don't forget to let those who missed the meeting, know what is happening. As time goes by, you may want to consider a combination of in person meetings that are also zoom meetings. Once again, contact by whatever means, those who missed the meeting. If your chapter has not met, contact me and we will look at what may be done for you.

Remember that I'm here to serve you. Let us go out and recruit members, train them and then get them involved. Once they are involved, find them doing something right, and commend them.

Patriot Medal

The Patriot Medal is the highest award presented to a Compatriot by a State Society and recognizes long faithful, outstanding, and distinguished service at the state and/or chapter level.

The Patriot Medal is awarded only by a State Society and may be presented only to an individual. Service at the national level is not considered in making the award. It is desirable that it be presented at the annual meeting of the State Society. A representative cannot accept the Patriot Medal. All requirements should be thoroughly reviewed before requesting this medal.

The Patriot Medal may be awarded annually by any state society. State societies with fewer than 500 members may present no more than one medal each calendar year. State societies with 500 to 1000 members may present two medals each calendar year. State societies with over 1000 members may present one medal for each 500 members. Georgia is authorized four medals this year.

Subsequent Presentation NOT Authorized: A Compatriot may receive this medal only once. Oak leaf clusters or other ribbon attachments are not Authorized.

William B. Dobbs, II has been a member since Oct 11, 1996, when joining the George Walton Chapter. Keeping a promise he made to PG James Westlake, he has worked hard over the past 24 years keeping the chapter active. Bill served as the George Walton Chapter Chaplain from 2004-2006. He has served as the chapter president for 16 years (2001-2002, 2003-2004, & 2006-2020). Bill is also a Dual Member of the Washington Wilkes Chapter and the Wiregrass Chapter. Bill served three years as the Central East Regional Vice President from 2016-2019. He was also a Georgia Society Board of Manager's Member at Large from 1998-2000. Bill was elected as the Georgia Society Senior Vice President for the 2019-2020 term. He was then elected Georgia Society President for the 2020-2021 term, serving effectively during the COVID pandemic, keeping the Georgia Society on a steady course. Bill is now serving as the Georgia Society Fundraising Committee Chairman for the 2022 National Congress to be held in Savannah, GA. Bill is a Life Member of the Brier Creek Battlefield Association, a Friend of the Library, a member of the Georgia Fellows and also a George Washington Endowment Fund member. On the National level, Bill is a supporter of the Rumbaugh Oration and Knight Essay Contest, being a Dr. Joseph Warren Medal and a Thomas Jefferson Medal holder.

At the Chapter level he has also served as Sergeant at Arms, Secretary, Treasurer, Vice President and President. He has served on numerous committees at the Chapter level. Bill has also served as State Genealogist for the Georgia Society. He is a regular attendee at the Georgia Society BOM's. He is a Charter Member of the Kettle Creek Battlefield Association. Bill is also a Dual Member of the Kings Mountain Chapter of the Tennessee Society.
