The applicant should demonstrate that a reasonable effort has been made to locate such evidence. No reference should be made to unsourced claims in published family histories. If vital records exist for the child in question, they must be submitted. The reviewing Genealogist might ask for further research if it is felt that important records have been overlooked. Copies of each source used to demonstrate the claimed relationship should be submitted with the analysis. Do not attach additional pages to this document.
