A guide for successfully completing
the score sheet and entering the
National Contests



Purpose

The purpose of this training presentation is to provide:

- 1) The rationale behind the score sheet format
- 2) Direction on how to correctly enter data
- 3) List common errors that have been observed over the years
- 4) Encourage chapters and state societies to complete and file an entry annually



Rationale

The Americanism contest is actually **FOUR** different contests that are combined into **ONE** score sheet.

- the **Liberty Bell Americanism Award** recognizes the top chapters that participate in the various educational outreach programs of the SAR
- the **Allene Wilson Groves Americanism Award** recognizes the top state societies that participate in the various educational outreach programs of the SAR
- the **President General's Streamer Award** is presented to the top chapters and State Societies that record the best efforts with respect to various administrative goals that contribute to the success of the SAR
- the **President General's Cup** is presented annually to the top chapter(s) with respect to a combined scoring system of both the Liberty Bell and President Generals Streamer awards and chapter membership levels

Awards are presented based on chapter / State Society size.

These began in 1978 as scrapbook contests. Eventually a score sheet was introduced to capture data for the contests and the scrapbook requirement was dropped. Revisions added categories to earn additional points. By 2009 the score sheet had grown to 32 different categories in which points could be earned. Often, data entry for a single event would have to be made in as many as 6 different categories to earn the maximum number of points.

The score sheet was in both EXCEL and WORD formats with a lot of the items counting in both contests. State Societies also developed their own score sheet versions which were then passed to other state societies. Due to the complexity and multiple formats, the contests eventually evolved into where just a few chapters and state societies were competing each year.



Rationale

In 2010 the score sheet was revised to 20 tabs and then to 16 tabs in 2011. Loopholes were closed in the revision process and data entry was redesigned so that a single event could be entered on a single tab in most instances. This revision process also eliminated the issue of having data count in both the Americanism and President General's contests.

The current score sheet is offered only in an EXCEL format that allows points to be calculated based on specific data entry. Embedded formulas are used to convert the entered data into points that the EXCEL spreadsheet tabulates. Point totals are then presented on the actual tab and as a grand total for the chapter / State Society on the Cover Sheet.

This has resulted in an increase in excitement about these contests which is directly attributed to the simpler form. With the increased excitement has come tremendous increases in the number of entries. And with the increase in entries has come new first time winners.

The first tab is the Cover Sheet which displays and/or records:

- (1) deadline information
- (2) submitter contact points
- (3) data related to the entity that is entering the contests
- (4) totals from each subsequent tab that are summed for the grand total of the entity
- (5) the most recent revision date for the score sheet.

Most of the Cover Sheet is protected with data entry restricted to certain areas.

In fact, no point total data entry is allowed on the Cover Sheet. These areas report results as calculated on the respective tabs.

The Cover Sheet is divided into two sections. The top section (left) contains basic instructions and deadlines. This is the only place for data entry on this tab.

The colored cells indicate the data to be entered by the committee / contest chairman for the chapter or state.

“Membership as of” data is critical. It impacts (1) the class in which the entry will compete, (2) the points that are generated on Tab 14 and (3) how the points for the President General’s Cup are tabulated.

The final colored cell is a dropdown selection that designates if the score sheet is for a Chapter or a State Society. This selection impacts point limitations on various tabs.

This area of the Cover Sheet is a “Report Only” section. No data entry is allowed since each cell contains a formula that looks to a corresponding cell on each tab for the point totals.

Americanism points are reported in **RED** while President General points are reported in **BLUE**.

This color scheme is maintained throughout the score sheet. Tab title and point totals are displayed in the corresponding contest color.

At the bottom of the Cover Sheet is the “Last Revised Date”. Be sure to check this so that the most current form is being used.



Summary Tab

The President General's / Americanism Award Score Sheet

The **President General's Award** recognizes chapters and state societies for their efforts to achieve the administrative goals of the SAR and who contribute to the success of the NSSAR. The **Americanism Awards (Allene Wilson Groves Award** for state societies and the **Liberty Bell Award** for chapters) recognizes the societies and chapters that participate in outreach education efforts and who acknowledge community leaders for their efforts to perpetuate the goals of the SAR. The **President General's Cup** recognizes the chapter that best achieves the goals of both the President General's and Americanism Awards.

These awards began in 1978 (last revised in 2010) for chapters or state societies to compete by accumulating points awarded for various program activities. The reporting period for this competition is **January 1st through December 31st**. Completed entries should be mailed via certified mail with return receipt or via email to the National Americanism Committee Chairman no later than **March 1st**. **To be considered a complete entry, this form must have all tabs completed and be received in its entirety by the National Americanism Committee Chairman by 11:59 pm (Eastern Time Zone) on the day stated as the deadline.** Supporting documentation may be asked for if needed.

For the purpose of calculating the winner of the President General's Cup, no individual score sheet category may count for more than 20% of the total score. No chapter will be eligible for this award unless it has scored points in at least 75% of the score sheet categories. The chapters in the President General's Cup competition will be judged using a weighted equation on a per member basis.

Awards:

Four (4) first place Liberty Bell awards and **four (4) President General Streamer awards** will be presented to chapters based on these membership size groups: 1 to 49; 50 to 99; 100 to 199; and 200 or more members. **Two (2) first place Allene Wilson Groves awards** will be presented to state societies based on these membership size groups: 1 to 999 and 1,000 or more members. **Four (4) first place President General Streamer awards** will be presented to state societies based on these membership size groups: 1 to 199; 200 to 499; 500 to 999; and 1,000 or more members. **Two (2) PG Cup awards** will be made for chapters of 1-80 members and 81 or more members. A state society or chapter may not win in two (2) consecutive years unless there are no other entries in that category in the second year. In the event that a chapter or state society is ineligible to win but would have won based on point totals, then that chapter or state society will receive an Honorable Mention.

General Guidelines:

(1) Membership will be defined as current, paid-up members, regardless of membership classification, at January 1st of the start of the contest year and at December 31st (the end of the contest year). The January 1st total will determine within which membership group the entry will be placed. The December 31st total will be used as the total to calculate the per capita total for the PG Cup contest.

(2) A chapter or state society may only count those SAR members who are primary members of that chapter or state. Compatriots participating in an event outside the boundary of their primary membership state society will earn points for their primary chapter and state society regardless of where the event is located.

(3) Where any category indicates a maximum number of points allowed, that maximum applies to chapters only, and it applies for that category for the year unless otherwise indicated. State Societies do not have a limit on the number of points that can be accumulated in any category unless specifically noted on the Category tab.

(4) In order to encourage compatriots to participate in Revolutionary War era uniforms or clothing, points may be earned for the wearing of a uniform or period attire. The issue of earning additional points for carrying or firing a firearm at an event is currently under consideration by the Americanism Committee.

(5) Points may be earned for awarding a medal or certificate to a person; however, points may not be earned for awarding a Certificate of Appreciation to that same recipient. For example, if a JROTC medal is presented to a cadet, points cannot be earned for presenting that same entrant a Certificate of Appreciation.

(6) In order to earn points for conducting a youth contest or other program, there must be at least one (1) contestant in the program.

(7) Where specific data entry is indicated, be sure to enter the specific data in the format requested. Failure to do so will result in no points being generated. For example, if a section states "Mark with an 'X'", then enter "X"; if it calls for "Uniform", enter "Uniform." Any other entry will result in no points.

The second tab provides information on the various contests.

The top section gives a basic background and repeats deadlines for entry (the first time is on the Cover Sheet tab).

The middle section describes the size categories that the contest is broken into.

The bottom section provides general guidelines. Most of the common data entry errors are addressed here, so this should be reviewed annually on the state level so that new committee / contest chairmen are aware of the common errors.

If published by an online journal that has no hardcopy edition or if using the online newspaper article, only the original article earns points. Articles printed on television or radio station websites or non-journalistic websites (i.e. blogs, social media sites) are excluded. **(50 points per Article in Non-SAR Publications / 2,000 point maximum)**

Each tab follows the same format. At the top will be the contest that the tab reports to.

Next will be a definition of the activity that earns points, the points earned for the activity and any point limitations.

Finally, the data entry area is provided. Each tab is set up so that as you hit either “TAB” or “ENTER”, the cursor will move to the next cell in which data may be entered.

A state society can only earn points for its own website or social media site - it cannot count chapter sites. Color Guard Bonuses

Beginning with Tab 3, the Color Guard Bonus is introduced.

This bonus is earned when an SAR member participates at an event as a Color Guardsman – in an uniform or clothing as described in the Color Guard Handbook. This bonus can be found on Tabs 3, 5, 6, 7, 8, 10, 11 and 15. The form of the data entry is basically the same and is shown here just this one time.

The rationale behind the repetitiveness of the Color Guard bonus is due to the fact that the Color Guard is considered the most visible aspect of the SAR when interacting with the public.

COMMON ERROR: The formula in the “Uniform or Clothing” column is keyed to look for either “Uniform” or “Clothing” to record points. Any other entry will not register.

CAVEAT: The Color Guard bonus is the only remaining allowed “double counting” in the score sheet. This occurs on the tabs where points are awarded for the number of members attending the event. Those members that attend and are part of the color guard earn an extra 10 points over those who just attend.

Points are earned based on a SCHEDULED Meeting or Function with the C.A.R. and/or the DAR. If both are present, then the event only counts ONCE. Points are not earned based on the number of SAR members in attendance.

Color guard bonus points are earned for each member that attends and / or participates as a part of the color guard.

Points are also earned for both monetary support and leadership support. **Note that only the RECIPIENT is listed and not the donor.**

Youth programs are the best way to earn a lot of points each year

There must be at least 1 participant for points to be earned. For example, the chapter awards one Bronze JROTC. The chapter earns a total of 75 points: 50 for sponsoring the program, 10 for the participant and 15 for awarding the medal.

The Color Guard Bonus can add 10 bonus points if the presentation is made by a member in color guard attire.

COMMON ERROR: Note at 6C: ***“Cannot be counted in Category 12”***. This is a common double counting error. This tab is the only place to earn points for medals presented as part for the Youth Programs.



Tab 7 – Public Service Programs

Tab 7 is the most detailed tab of the score sheet. It captures data from a multitude of activities that are all categorized as Public Service Programs. Note the statement that address potential double or triple counting at the top of the tab.

The following are the various activities recorded on this tab:

7A For each Law Enforcement, Fire Safety, EMS, or Heroism Medal presented. Place an "X" to denote the medal awarded. **(25 points/medal) Cannot be counted in Category 12.**

Common Errors

Common errors noted over time and pointed out that need to be re-emphasized:

- 1) Not entering the required data that is called for.

This error is most often seen in the Color Guard Bonus sections when “Uniform” or “Clothing” is not entered.

- 2) Not entering data on the appropriate tab

This error is most often seen in entering Medals & Awards (Tabs 6, 7 and 12) on the wrong tab or even double entering the awards.

This error is also seen in entering parade data on Tab 10 instead of Tab 7.

- 3) Taking credit for an event that the chapter or State Society did not sponsor.

This error is most often seen on Tabs 10 & 11 where a chapter or State Society attends an event hosted / sponsored by another chapter or State Society and then claims the event as one that it hosted / sponsored.



Contact Points

If there is an issue with data entry or if there is a question, contact points can be found in multiple places.

- 1) The Cover Sheet of the score sheet lists the name and address of the NSSAR Americanism Committee Chairman. The score sheet is submitted to the committee chairman to enter the contest.
- 2) The NSSAR Americanism web page on the NSSAR website lists the chairman's name and contact points.
- 3) The NSSAR Forms webpage is where the score sheet can be found. It is usually uploaded no later than the second week of March to allow for final revisions in that year's score sheet.
- 4) The NSSAR home page lists announcements about the contest and provides links to the score sheet and other pertinent pages.



Timeline & Deadlines

The pertinent dates related to the contests are as follows:

January 1st to December 31st ---- Contest period matches the calendar year

February 28th ---- Deadline for score sheets to be submitted to committee chair

March 15th ---- Usually the latest that the year's score sheet will be uploaded to the NSSAR website (*allows for final changes approved at the Spring Leadership Meeting to be incorporated*)

July ---- Contest winners announced at the Annual NSSAR Congress

Most importantly:

Data entry should occur throughout the contest year instead of waiting until between January 1st and February 28th to try to recreate the entire year.



Questions
